## “RED CARPET” EVENT HIGHLIGHTS THE WORK OF THE FRANKLIN H. WILLIAMS COMMISSION

**OLD ERIE COUNTY HALL, BUFFALO** On Tuesday, October 24, 2023, at the Old Erie County Hall in Buffalo, Hon. Shirley Troutman, Associate Judge of the Court of Appeals and Mary Lynn Nicolas-Brewster Esq., Executive Director of the Franklin H. Williams Judicial Commission, were two of the many attendees who walked the red carpet at the premiere of a “Studental Perspective”, a follow-up to the Commission’s award-winning PBS documentary, “A Bridge to Justice: The Life of Franklin H. Williams.”

As a sequel to the documentary and with the assistance of PBS, Ms. Nicolas-Brewster interviewed on camera

several Buffalo area students who viewed the film, offering their perception of Ambassador Williams and the continuing struggle for equity and fairness in society. In addition to the screening of the video, scholarships were awarded to students who participated in an essay contest on Ambassador Williams. Finally, a panel discussion was held on the importance of multicultural education.
